Grants of up to \$2000, for the purpose of relocation to Adelaide from interstate or regional South Australia, are available to outstanding applicants who wish to study the Bachelor of Visual Art or the Bachelor of Visual Art [Hons] on a full-time basis at Adelaide Central School of Art.

Funds provided will support relocation costs to enable the student to move to Adelaide, South Australia. Application details and information overleaf.

Relocation Grant Information

About

Adelaide Central School of Art Relocation Grants provide financial support of up to \$2000 to new students from interstate or regional South Australia who are accepted into full-time study in the Bachelor of Visual Art or Bachelor of Visual Art [Honours] at Adelaide Central School of Art (the School). Funds provided will support relocation costs to enable the student to move to Adelaide, South Australia.

Relocation costs supported may include:

- Freight of furniture / belongings to Adelaide
- Costs associated with a rental agreement (e.g. bond payment or connecting utilities)
- Transportation costs to travel to Adelaide (e.g. petrol / vehicle hire / airfare)

Eligibility

- Any new student living outside South Australia at the time of applying, who is accepted to study the Bachelor of Visual Art or the Bachelor of Visual Art [Hons] program, is eligible to apply OR
- Any new student living in regional South Australia (as defined by the Local Government Council Map found at www.lga.sa.gov.au/councilmaps) at the time of applying, who is accepted to study the Bachelor of Visual Art or the Bachelor of Visual Art [Hons] program, is eligible to apply
- Applicants commit to study full time for the first year
- Applicants must provide evidence of living outside of SA or regionally for at least 12 months prior to applying
- Applicants must discuss their application and intention to relocate with Andrew Herpich, Student Liaison Officer, prior to submission of an application
- All application details must be completed

There are penalties which may require the refund of the grant back to the School:

- if you completely withdraw from study without a valid reason within the first 6 months of study
- if you fail a subject due to misconduct or non-attendance
- if you accept the grant but do not commence study at the School

Criteria

- Applicant's commitment to study full time for the first year
- Applicant's commitment to relocating to Adelaide or South Australia to study visual art at the School
- Applicant's commitment to contribute to student life and the collegial environment of the School

Application Process

Applications for Relocation Grants are assessed by a panel. Applicants must submit a Relocation Grant Application Form with all fields and sections completed by the deadline. Applicants must discuss their application and intention to relocate with Andrew Herpich, Student Liaison Officer, prior to submission.

Applicants must submit a separate application for entry into the BVA or BVA [Hons], prior to (or with) the grant application. Please refer to the application form for further information.
